

15-year-olds

You're eligible to take the 30 hour driver education class. Here, you'll learn the rules of the road. At the end of the course, the Certificate of Completion will be necessary to receive a Driver License (but it's not mandatory for your instruction permit).

15 ½ -year-olds

Now, you can go to the DMV and apply for your instruction permit. Remember,

- You must be at least 15½
- Your parent or guardian must go with you and sign a financial responsibility statement
- There are fees for licensing and testing
- You must present Proof of Identity (for example, a certified U.S.-issued birth certificate)
- You must supply a Social Security Number (present your Social Security card at the time you apply)
- You must provide a Nevada street address
- You must take a 50-question written test

NOTE: You don't need to take the written test again in order to get your license

(The actual Nevada Driver License test has 50 questions, and you must answer 40 correctly to pass. If you pass, you'll receive an instruction permit that allows you to drive. Until you receive your license, you can only drive with a licensed driver 21 years of age or older. This person must have at least one year of driving experience and must be seated next to you at all times. In order to move on to your Driver License, you must have 50 hours of behind-the-

wheel experience. 10 hours of that must be in darkness.
These hours must be noted on the official log sheet,
available for download at the DMV website.)
