

## Motorcycles and Mopeds

If you choose to drive on two wheels, you have requirements above and beyond those of a regular (Class C) license.

### *To ride a motorcycle*

- You must already have a valid Class C Driver License
- You must complete an approved course, either through a private entity or the Nevada DMV, and receive a Certificate of Completion
- You must take a knowledge test—and pass it—before taking a skills test
- Once you have your Class M Driver License, you must get your cycle registered, just as you would a car
- You *must* wear a helmet

### *To ride a moped or scooter*

- You must have your Class C license (you *don't* need a Class M)
- You don't need insurance or registration
- Your vehicle does need all applicable safety equipment, such as lights and mirrors, to be driven on a public street
